CARERS COMMUNITY FUND UPDATE

The Carers Community Fund, funded by the Better Care Fund Allocation, aims to provide local community support for unpaid carers in Essex, offering digital services and refreshers of training opportunities. In the first year over £800,000 has been allocated for 74 local projects to support unpaid carers of all ages, providing activities, advice and guidance for over 4500 carers. The feedback indicates it has been a resounding success and year 2 looks promising with more funding released.

UNPAID CARERS TRAINING

Many unpaid carers request help with training in their caring role and dealing with difficult situations. They say that if they had some basic training at the start of their caring journey it would have prepared them better.

'I accessed extremely good moving and handling training but had to pay for it as courses weren't currently being run for family carers in this area. More free courses on things like Moving and handling, pressure care, nutrition, dementia would be invaluable.'
